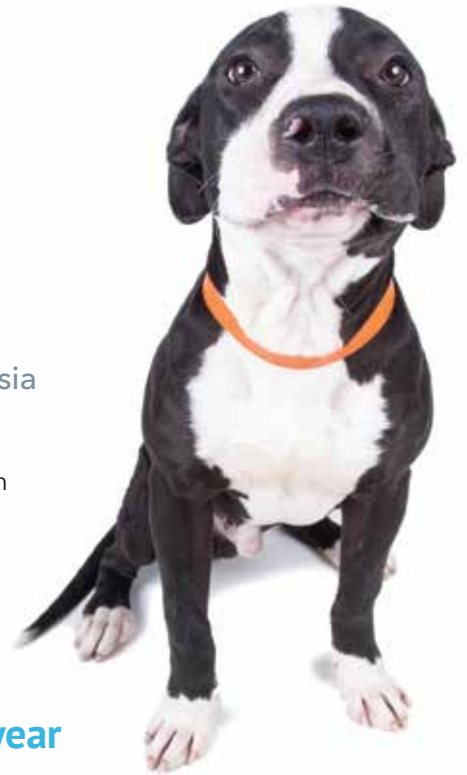


## WHY LIFELINE?

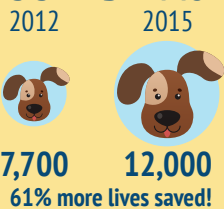


### THE CHALLENGE

### LIVES SAVED ANNUALLY



Even with the cards stacked against us, we have saved nearly 40,000 animals in the last three years of managing DeKalb and Fulton County Animal Services.

**WE'VE INCREASED ADOPTIONS BY 150% SINCE 2012!**

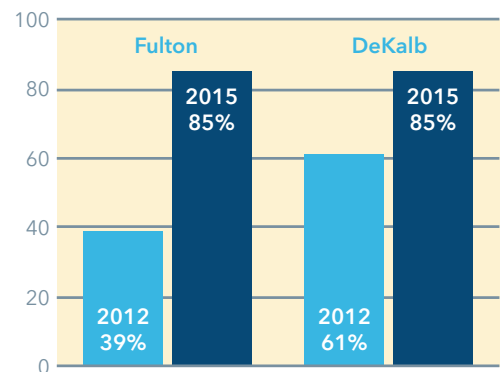
### GETTING TO NO-KILL

No-kill is defined as saving **90% or more of the animals coming in to our shelters**. When we took over the two county shelters in 2013, lifesaving rates were 39% at Fulton and 61% at DeKalb. **In November of 2015, we attained no-kill levels at our Fulton County Animal Services shelter. Additionally, in March 2016, we hit a no-kill milestone at DeKalb!**

### WE ARE MAKING HISTORY

**This is the first time ever in Atlanta that an open-admission animal shelter (one where no animals are turned away) has achieved no-kill levels.**
