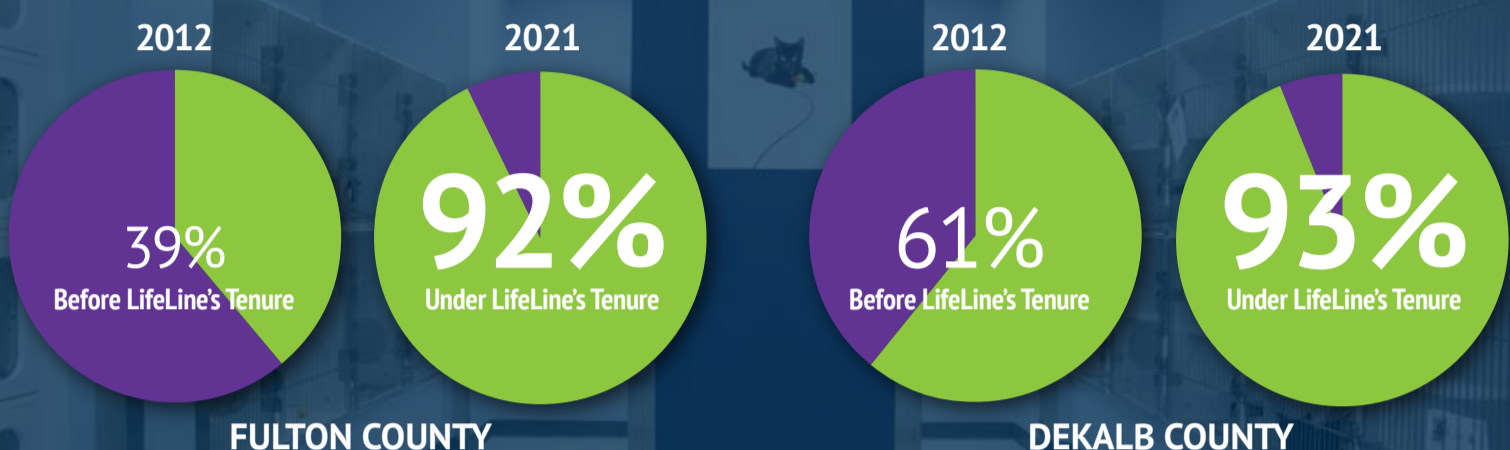

OUR HISTORY

FOR OVER 20 YEARS, LIFELINE ANIMAL PROJECT HAS BEEN WORKING HARD to end the euthanasia of healthy and treatable animals in county shelters. From our humble beginnings as a virtual online shelter to a nationally-lauded organization and the largest animal welfare nonprofit in the state, we have saved thousands of lives and obtained first-time no-kill rates in the two Atlanta county shelters we manage.

KEEPING PEOPLE AND PETS TOGETHER WHERE THEY BELONG

WHEN THE PANDEMIC FIRST STARTED, WE SAW A PROFOUND NEED TO HELP KEEP PEOPLE AND PETS TOGETHER. With rent moratoriums lifting and many people still struggling, we expanded our support to people and their pets through initiatives like our Safety Net Fostering program and through our Community Support teams.

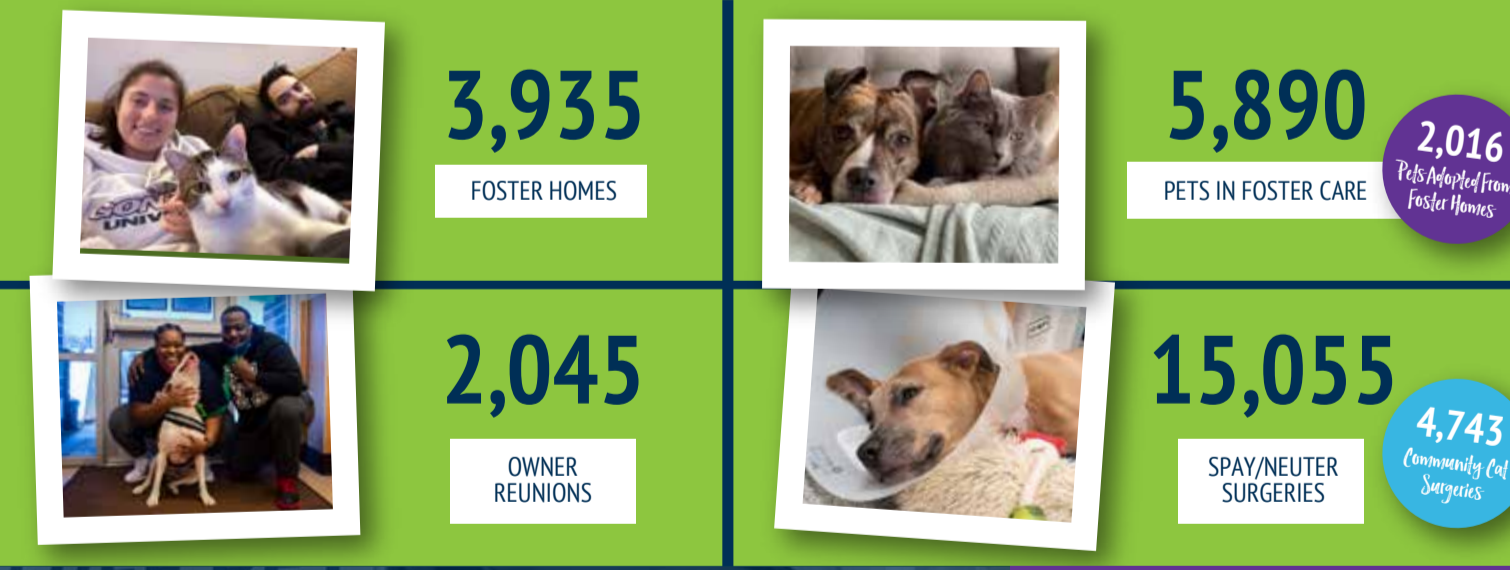
- Our **Safety Net Foster** program helps families keep their pets through temporary foster homes, enabling them to regain stability and keep their pets.
- We continued providing free pet food, medicine and veterinary services to those hit hardest by the pandemic.
- Our **Community Support** teams help struggling pet owners find pet supplies, veterinary care and other resources. **WE HAD 3,513 CASES IN 2021!**
- Our **Stay Together Fund** made veterinary surgery and services obtainable for those who couldn't otherwise afford them.

In 2021, our shelters returned to full capacity for the first time in over a year. It was a challenging summer with animal transports to rescues down by 51.6% (due to COVID restrictions), industry-wide staff shortages and almost 60 animals arriving daily. However, thanks to dedicated staff, volunteers and communities, we still reached no-kill save rates throughout the year. But it wasn't easy.

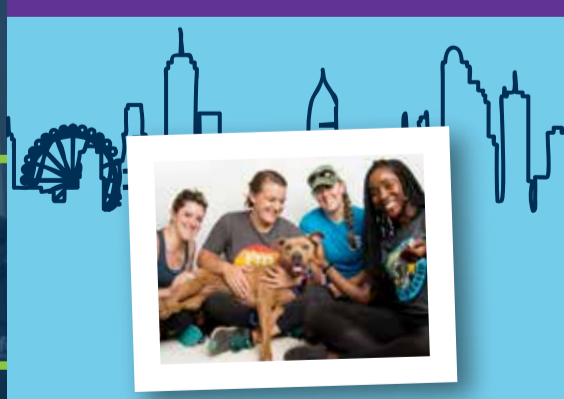


PETS FOR LIFE PROGRAM

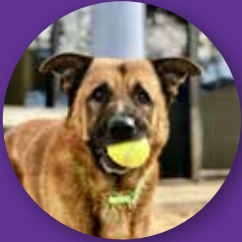

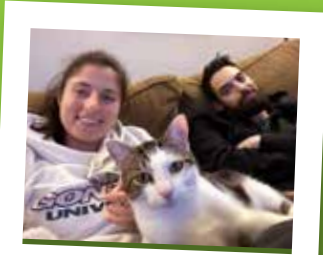
